INVITATION TO SILENCE

Tell a short story to introduce yourself to the assembly – this can be something lighthearted and fun, or a way you met Jesus in your life.

Define prayer and give clear directives to help them enter in (e.g., close your eyes, picture Jesus, extend hands with palms facing heaven).

Identify an obstacle in worship (e.g., fatigue, doubt). Then break it by saying, "In the name of Jesus, I break all _____." Then use "Call Forth."

Identify a fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22) that counters the obstacle and call it forth. "In the name of Jesus, I call forth a release of _____."

Quote scripture for the assembly. This can be something that edifies and encourages the group. Let the power of God's Word do the work!

Invite the assembly to join you in praying the Prayer of Salvation (giving Jesus permission to be the center of their lives).

Connect the prayers of the assembly to a global intention (e.g., revival, end to abortion, peace in Middle East). Invite them to engage with it as well.

In the name of Jesus, call forth an outpouring or an increase of the Holy Spirit's outpouring in the room.

Invite the assembly into a time of silence where they actively listen for and give space for God's response.
Clarify how long to expect the silence (e.g., 1 min, 10 min).

Rapport and trust is created between you and the assembly. They're more willing to follow if you create connection with them.

This helps groups who are brand new to corporate worship to feel safe, learn how to pray, and enter in.

This removes the obstacle to worship through the authority of the name of Jesus. Note: It is important to follow immediately with "Calling Forth".

This brings the release of a fruit of the Spirit upon the assembly through the authority of the name of Jesus.

"The word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit...able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart" Heb. 4:12

Jesus is actively given permission to move in their hearts and lives. This gives them a concrete moment where they know they gave Jesus their life.

This both engages and unifies the assembly via an intention.
Sometimes it's easier for us to pray for something outside of ourselves.

"If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" Luke 11:13

God's first language is silence and necessary to hear His voice. Silence is not in opposition to corporate worship. Rather, worship music can position us to better focus and hear Him, even corporately.
